## School Board Nominations

A great deal of work has been accomplished this year clarifying the relationship between St. John's Church and St. John's Episcopal School. The School's "Operational Policies" are meant to enhance the work of the School Board as it provides strategic leadership for this important ministry of St. John's Church. While legal responsibility for the School rests with the Vestry and the priest-in-charge, the School Board is charged to "promote the School's Episcopal identity...guide and direct the character, mission, and culture of the School, establish overall policies, maintain financial stability, lead in fundraising, establish criteria for an acceptance of gifts, and participate in an annual evaluation of its work".

In order accomplish those responsibilities the School Board recently developed some criteria for new members of the Board. That criteria included a person with experience in financial management (both strategic and tactical), a person with administrative abilities, a person with strong educational experience, a person with communications skills which can "bridge" the various constituents of the School, a person with a legal background, a person who has vision and who looks to the future, and a person with technology credentials and marketing skills.

There is an opportunity to elect up to four new members of the Board this Spring. If you would like to be considered to be on the School Board or you know someone we should consider, please write a letter outlining your (or that person's) strengths, skills, and experience particularly in light of the School Board's responsibilities and the criteria listed above. The letter should be sent to the school office by April 30.

**Rummage Sale**

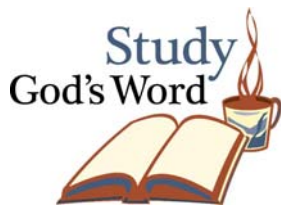

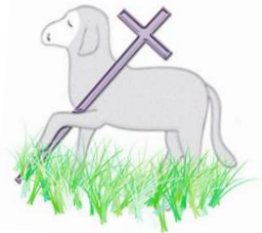

## **Reminder from Student Services:**

New California law states that every student entering 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade must have a booster shot to prevent whooping cough. Please make sure that you take your students to their doctor to get this shot and bring your updated shot record to the Student Services Office. Your child will not be able to start school next September without proof that they have received this shot.



## **Also:**

If your child has a fever, please keep them home from school until they have been fever-free (without medicine) for 24 hours. Please do not give them a fever-reducer and send them to school- a fever is a sign of an illness that might be contagious.

Please make sure that the phone numbers we have for you are current, so that we can reach you if your child is sick or injured, or if they forgot their lunch.

## *President Obama and First Lady Address Bullying*

St. John's School is committed to stopping bullying and to creating an atmosphere in which all students feel safe and care for one another. In the coming months you will hear more about our new programs which will teach parents and students about the issue of bullying and about how we can be a school that is safe and supportive of one another so that bullying has no place here. The first of those programs is the three part series with psychologist Gabriel Bello beginning on **Monday, March 28th at 7:00 pm.**

Here is an article on the Internet that was found by our 6th grade teacher, Mrs. Quirk, about Facebook and bullying. Please take a moment to watch the video and read the article about the important steps Facebook is taking to protect our children. Here is the article on President Obama and First Lady Obama's speech on bullying on CNN:

**(CNN)** -- Facebook announced two new safety features Thursday in conjunction with a White House summit on bullying.

A new reporting tool will let Facebook users, including teens and younger users, to privately report troubling content not just to the site itself but to parents, teachers and others in their support system.

And an improved Safety Center, due out in the next few weeks, will provide educational videos, articles and other content created by bullying experts to help adults address the problem.

"Today's summit is about collaboration and being innovative in the ways in which we address safety," the networking giant wrote on its [Facebook Safety](#) page. "We hope these new resources will help all of us -- parents, teachers, kids, safety experts, and Facebook itself -- work together to create safer environments."

In a video posted on the safety page, President Barack Obama and first lady Michelle Obama encourage Facebook members to join in the effort to decrease bullying, both online and off.

"For a long time, bullying was treated as an unavoidable part of growing up," President Obama says in the video. "But more and more we're seeing how harmful it can be for our kids, especially when it follows them from their school to their phone to their computer screen."

Facebook said the "social reporting" feature is intended to get reports of bullying to the people with the best chance of stopping it.

Under the new system, a user could identify a photo, status update or other item as bullying them, then privately send a message to someone in their friend network about it.

"Safety and child psychology experts tell us that online issues are frequently a reflection of what is happening offline," Facebook wrote. "By encouraging people to seek help from friends, we hope that many of these situations can be resolved face to face."

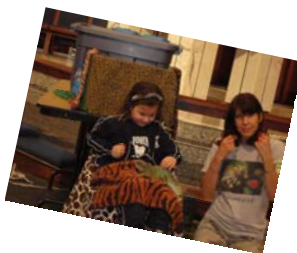

## High School Admissions

We are very pleased to announce that our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who applied to private high schools this year did very, very well. Out of 18 girls who applied at Our Lady of Peace Academy, 17 were accepted. Out of 9 who applied to Mater Dei Catholic High School, 8 were accepted. Out of eleven boys who applied to St. Augustine Catholic High School, 7 were accepted. Out of 6 who applied to Frances Parker, 4 were accepted. And out of 6 who applied to The Bishop's School, all 6 were accepted.

We are proud of all of our students in this terrific 8<sup>th</sup> grade class and proud of all our teachers who have been a part of preparing these students for their future high school experience.

## Elementary Presidential Fitness

*"Today more than ever, our students need help leading active, healthy lives. That's where educators come in. They're on the front lines of fitness, working to teach our kids the fundamentals of healthy living. The President's Challenge wants to help. We've created the Physical Fitness Test as a tool to help educators bring out the best in their students."*



Students began testing for Presidential fitness Monday March 21, 2011 and will conclude the second week in April. Each student will be allowed to retest any event in order to obtain a blue or red patch. Initial test scores will be posted on Edline Monday April 4, 2011. Students who receive the Presidential Fitness award (blue) rank in the 85<sup>th</sup> percentile among all students nationally. Students receiving the National Fitness award (red) are based off the standards from the 1985 National School Population Fitness Survey. Standards were validated in 1998 through comparison with a large nationwide sample collected in 1994.

New this year, St. John's will submit the names and scores of all students who obtained the Presidential Fitness award to see where St. John's ranks in the state. State Champion Schools are determined by the percent of students who receive a Presidential Fitness Award. The goal in entering us in the State Championships is to improve our state rank each year. Students are required to do five events pull ups, sit-ups, sit and reach, shuttle run, and a distance run.

As an example of the standards for receiving an award, a 6 year old boy would be required to do 33 curl ups, complete the shuttle run in 12.1 seconds, stretch for 31 centimeters in sit and reach, complete a quarter mile run in 1:55 minutes, and do 2 pull-ups. A student achieving each of these scores would be given a Presidential Fitness (blue) award.

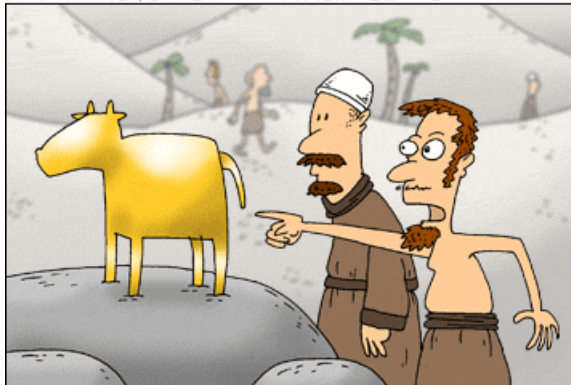

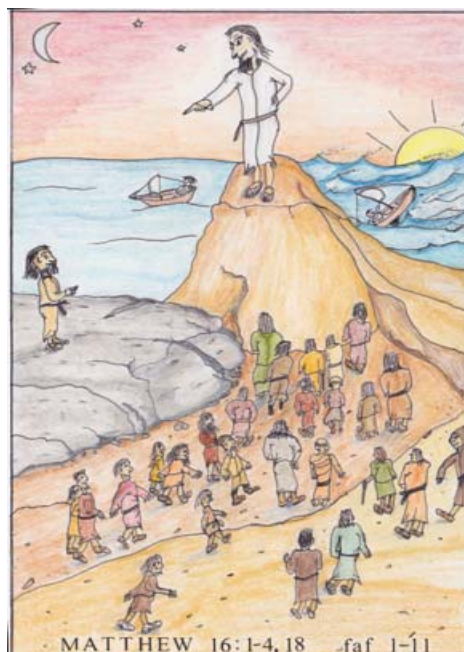
