2011 Lent at Saint John's

In the Ash Wednesday liturgy, we are invited “to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God’s holy word”. This year St. John’s offers a number of opportunities to live a holy Lent that center around our mission statement: “to be a Christian community that intentionally gathers to experience God’s love through Episcopal worship, education, fellowship, and ministry to the wider community”.

EPISCOPAL WORSHIP:

In addition to our regular Sunday services, Compline is said at the conclusion of the Adult Bible Study each Tuesday night at 6:30pm. Each Wednesday night beginning on March 16th, a service designed around the Stations of the Cross which will follow after a parish soup supper.

EDUCATION:

Adult Bible Study continues to be offered each Tuesday night at 6:30 p.m. where we study the lessons appointed for the coming Sunday with the goal of helping us all discern how those lessons may speak to our lives. A special Lenten Forum will be held each Sunday after the 8am service in order to help us live out that portion of our Vision Statement that states we seek “to learn more about who we are as a congregation, as members of the Diocese of San Diego, as members of The Episcopal Church, and as members of the Anglican Communion”.

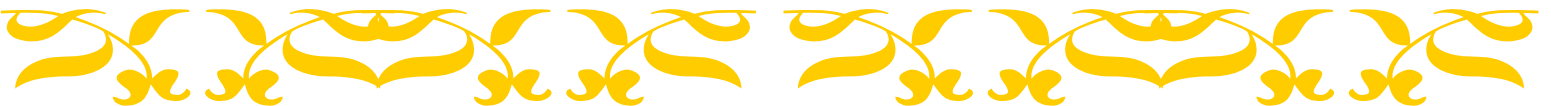

OUR OWN ANA GARCIA RECOGNIZED AT DIOCESAN CONVENTION

Ana Garcia, our senior warden over the last two years, was the only person at convention presented with both the Bishop's Service Award and the Bishop's Cross. Here is the citation which the Bishop read when he presented the BISHOP'S CROSS:

Ana Garcia

Married at St. Paul's Cathedral, Ana and her husband, Tim, made St. John's Episcopal Church in Chula Vista their home. Their two children were educated at the parish school and both Tim and Ana have served the parish in a variety of posts.

In our common life as the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego, Ana has also brought her considerable talents and wisdom to the diocese. For the last four years, Ana has served as a member of the Standing Committee of the Diocese of San Diego, and in 2009 she served as that body's president.

What strikes most people about Ana is that she is always present and usually somewhat quiet. She is observant and reflective. She is able to see things that others do not see and to say the truth that needs to be stated. Her counsel and advice to this bishop over these four years has been an immense blessing and a behind-the-scenes gift to this diocese. I would not have wanted to travel the more difficult parts of the last four years without Ana's guidance.

While performing this service for the diocese, Ana continued her work at St. John's as a lector and chalice bearer. She has also served as a member of the vestry, and as the senior warden during the last two years. What is particularly noteworthy is that during this tenure as senior warden she has lead a parish in a most challenging time of transition. This service at St. John's has been costly to Ana; she has borne the cross of leadership for her church.

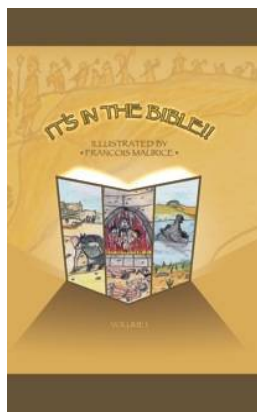

I have found out that the book entitled, **NO STRINGS ATTACHED**, is available for \$10 (soft cover) or \$25 (hard cover). You can purchase the book by paying the appropriate amount to Wendy Romo, Parish Administrative Assistant, between now and Monday, April 4th. The books will be ordered that day, Father Bill will sign each of them, and they will be ready for you by the time of his departure on April 24th.

An additional benefit of purchasing the book is that all proceeds go to the William S. Wade Fund for Financial Aid at St. Andrew's-Sewanee School which provides assistance to low-income families who would have no hope of an independent education for their sons and daughters. Thus your purchase will enable Fr. Bill's school to live out its mission statement that includes providing "educational opportunities for those students for whom such experiences might not otherwise be available".

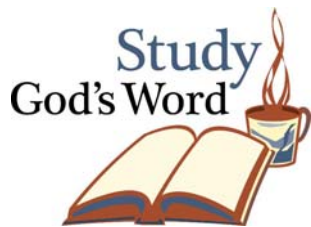

ST. JOHN'S PARISH DAY SCHOOL NEWS

Early in the morning, Monday thru Friday from September to June, children and their parents wake up in Tijuana and prepare for the drive to Chula Vista to attend Saint John's Episcopal Parish Day School. At the same time, students living in Chula Vista, and other cities around the South Bay, do the same as they come together at Saint John's School to begin a day of learning and fun. It's like a family reunion every day across a border which does not divide us. At Saint John's, we celebrate this cross cultural opportunity as a gift to the entire community of teachers, parents and staff.



Saint John's School is a part of Saint John's Episcopal Church, which began in 1922. In 1951, the people of Saint John's Church decided that they wanted to have a school as part of the ministry of the Church, and Saint John's Episcopal Parish Day School was founded. For 60 years, our students have come from a variety of religious backgrounds and traditions to be part of this excellent School. We value, celebrate and respect this wonderful diversity through our classroom work and our weekly worship, and believe that this diversity strengthens us and provides us with opportunities for learning from one another.

Every Wednesday morning, beginning at 9:30 a.m., we gather to worship as Christian brothers and sisters in the celebration of the Holy Communion. Students read the lessons, provide the music as a choir, serve at the altar, and occasionally preach the sermon. We welcome and encourage all students, regardless of their family's religious affiliation, to participate fully in worship. This Christian atmosphere allows for a friendly, creative, and ethical approach to education, and shapes the whole child as a citizen of the world community.

Our curriculum is guided by the California State Standards for each grade level and we continue to strive for standards of excellence through strong academics, athletic programs which teach team work and skill, music and art programs which enrich our students' appreciation of the arts, and religious education, which helps to shape and form our students as people of faith. With our new computer lab, our students receive an excellent hands-on education in computer technology.

Our students go on to high schools in the greater San Diego area including the Bishop's School, Mater Dei High School, St. Augustine High School, Our Lady of Peace High School, Frances Parker High School, and La Jolla Country Day School as well as eastern boarding schools and local public schools.

Here are some of the things our 8th grade students are saying about Saint John's:

- The education is fun and I get to do this with my friends!
- The teachers are very supportive and they make you the best student possible.
- My classmates and I are all really close together and the teachers are very nice.
- Saint John's School fosters a sense of unity and closeness. We know nearly everyone in the school and always lend each other a helping hand.
- I really think the teachers are the best and also my classmates.

The parents of Saint John's School tell us that they have chosen St. John's School because it offers good moral values and good education, faith formation, small classes, high standards, religious

Healthy School Lunch Ideas



Bringing a nutritious lunch is an essential part of your student's success at school. We have observed lunches filled with sugar and low nutrition coming to school with your children. Please take a look at this article from the California Childcare Health Program for ideas which will help you provide the best possible lunches so that your student is given a great chance to be healthy and succeed at school.

Nutrition is particularly important for young children. The meals they eat are a vital part of their growth and development. If your families have older children who take a lunch to school or have meals served in their program, as providers you should ask them these questions:

- Are the lunches meeting the nutritional needs of the children?
- Are the children eating the lunches packed for them?
- Are the meals that the older children are receiving at school nutritious and do they offer a variety of choices?

If these are some of the questions that your families have been concerned about, share these sample lunch ideas to enhance children's lunches and meet their nutritional needs.

- Pack carrot and zucchini sticks, broccoli "trees," celery "boats" and pepper rings or sticks that are soft cooked (to prevent choking in children under 4 years of age).
- Pack sprouts, tomato slices and lettuce mixed with red cabbage, spinach and jicama slices to add variety to your child's lunches.
- Supply good sources of fiber and vitamins A and C such as apples (unpeeled), oranges, kiwi and pineapple slices, berries, bananas and unsweetened 100 percent juices (not a fruit drink).
- Try other calcium sources like hummus, beans, corn tortillas, low fat milk cheese, and yogurt, tofu, or cottage cheese with fruit. Be sure to pack tightly; use freezer packs to keep the food cold and to prevent spoilage.
- For variety, try replacing whole wheat bread with whole wheat bagels, corn or flour tortillas, or pita bread for making sandwiches.
- Other bread products that add spice to lunches are dry unsweetened cereals, flavored rice or corn cakes, muffins, and bread sticks.
- Cooked starches like casseroles made from rice, pasta, couscous or bulghur are great mixed with a variety of vegetables and meats like turkey, chicken, cheese, tuna, lean roast beef or beans. Keep in mind that these foods need to be stored in an air-tight thermos container to keep their freshness.
- Good, easy-to-pack protein ideas are string cheese and creamy peanut butter and jelly.
- New and exciting protein ideas are veggie burgers, salmon burgers, tempeh (tofu) fingers, beans or bean soup, and ground turkey. Again, be sure to store properly to prevent spoilage.

Working For A Safer School

As you know, First Avenue along St. John's Church and School can be a very dangerous place during dismissal. A couple of weeks ago, we received a call from a neighbor to tell us that he nearly hit a child coming out from between the parked cars to cross First Avenue. The City of Chula Vista has agreed to provide a crosswalk on the corner of First Avenue and Kearney Street sometime in the next few weeks. We will also provide an adult crossing guard for that crosswalk. Please follow the directions of the crossing guard and no longer cross First Avenue in the middle of the street. Please use the crosswalk so that you and your children will be safe. The police will be patrolling the street to be sure we are complying with the traffic safety rules so that we can keep both the drivers and the students safe.

Well Behaved Children

We are excited to tell you about three workshops we are offering for parents which will help parents with the important task of raising their children.

Having a good student, a good son or daughter, and a good classmate is the result of the responsible and committed work that both father and mother have with their child. Being a good student usually starts with them being well behaved. Well behaved children know to respect their parents; they do what is asked of them, which leads to them knowing the importance of respecting teachers and classmates as well. Having children who respect and obey authority figures can at times be a challenge, but it is a challenge well worth working on in order to help them to be successful in life. This seminar will address the issues of transitions from age to age through middle school, and bullying in school as a form of disrespect.

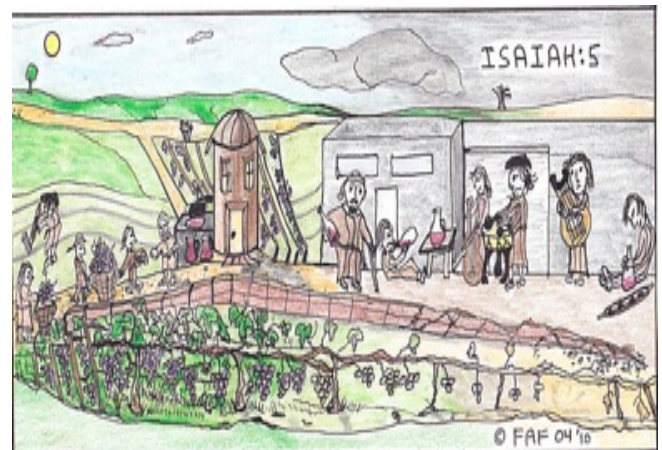
